About your Organisation:

Please describe the main activities of your organisation:

Community Speed Watch (CSW) gives local people the chance to be more actively involved in making Wiltshire's roads safer for everyone. Local residents, who are willing to volunteer a small amount of time each week help monitor speeds with 'state of the art' speed detection equipment in their own community. While CSW is not Speed Enforcement (this can only be conducted by trained and qualified Police staff), it is the next best thing. The main activities can be summarised as:

Once the training has been completed, the CSW Volunteers carry out speed monitoring on specified roads in their community. All sites are checked for safety and risks and the scheme can only be conducted at these specified sites. All volunteers agree to work within a 'Code of Practice' which ensures a consistent approach for all the schemes and the motoring public.

The CSW Volunteers then record the registration numbers of vehicles exceeding the local speed limit. This information is passed to the CSW Coordinator and a letter is sent from the Police warning the registered keeper of the vehicle. The scheme raises awareness of speeding issues by having a highly visible presence at the roadside and ultimately aims to reduce the speed of traffic making the Broad Town road safer.

Please provide details and the aim of your project:

The main aim of this project is to reduce the number of speeders and the speed of those speeders.

CSW undoubtedly does reduce speed, however, on average it takes 5 months to influence speeder behaviour and it does require manpower to operate the detector and log /report the results.

CSW led to high end repeat speeders (i.e. those drivers exceeding 50mph in the 30mph part of Broad Town) reduced their speed by 25% to 35%. CSW (as with enforcement) can't be 24/7 so can't eradicate the problem but certainly reminds/slows some drivers during sessions.

Speed activated signs automate what CSW teams do so the number and speed of speeders will hopefully be achieved without the need to man CSW sessions. This is obviously more efficient and also saves the unpleasant and unnecessary confrontation that volunteers are subjected to when angry speeders vent their anger.

CSW ran for 3 years until it became apparent that Broad Town would be unable to persuade new recruits to volunteer for a role that involved standing by the roadside, out in the rain/cold and quite often having to deal with angry speeders. The last report is attached for information.





3. CSW Year on year comparison


• % of speeders in BT by month
